Praying for Growth

We have launched a dedicated period of prayer that our diocese will grow both spiritually and numerically over the coming years.

By 2030 we pray that we shall have healthy and sustainable churches which are resourced and encouraged to worship God, make disciples, share hope, and transform their communities. We hope to have double the number of children and young people in our churches, at least 100 new worshipping communities and congregations of 150 people in each major area of population. None of this will happen without prayer.

Bishop John writes: "I would like to ask all of you to pray for our growth as Kingdom People, as we begin to put our vision into practice and work on the priorities we have agreed. This leaflet contains two short prayers you can use as individuals and in groups, not least at PCC Meetings, and a short litany of intercession which could be used either in meetings or from time to time in Sunday worship. I shall be praying these prayers regularly myself, and I hope you will join me."
