New Diocesan Secretary - Andy Todd

In September, Andy Todd (former vicar of St Stephen's, Worcester) began as our new Diocesan Secretary. Andy acts as the CEO of the Worcester Diocesan Board of Finance Ltd (WDBF), leading the diocesan staff team and working closely with the Bishop of Worcester and the Chair of the WDBF to lead the mission and ministry of the Diocese in Worcestershire and Dudley as well as ensure its financial stability.



Andy said: "Right at the heart of my vocation as a priest has been to walk alongside individuals, families and communities through the 'liminal' times of great change – the good and the bad, the challenging and the uplifting – and to seek God's grace in those times. There is a clear parallel with the role of Diocesan Secretary, supporting our churches through times which are extremely challenging, but also full of new possibility. That's what the four Diocesan Priorities are all about, and it's a huge privilege to lead a WDBF team committed to supporting our churches throughout this wonderful diocese."

Kidderminster West Nativity Celebrations

This year marks 800 years since St. Francis of Assisi created the first-ever nativity scene in Greccio, Italy. It is believed Francis' inspiration to do a live representation of the birth of Jesus came from his time in the Holy Land. Seeing the holy sites of Christ's birth, death, and resurrection made them feel more real to Francis and he wanted to recreate that experience for those who were not able to travel there.

On his way back from Rome in December 1223, Francis and Giovanni Velita, the lord of Greccio, set up a cave with live animals and a hay-filled manger. People flocked to see the candle-lit scene during the Christmas Mass.

Since then, nativity scenes have become commonplace in churches, buildings, and homes throughout the Advent and Christmas season. To mark the 800th anniversary, the team in Kidderminster West have planned a series of events. This includes a nativity trail, alongside encouraging schools and craft groups to create their own nativity scenes that can be shared with others.

Messy Church Gingerbread at Malvern Priory

The 'Gingerbread Nativity' brings the Christmas story to life in a different and very engaging way at Great Malvern Priory. Messy Church could be mistaken for the Great British Bake Off as excited children and their parents and carers decorate and create their very own edible nativity scene.

Starting with a chocolate stick stable, shredded wheat makes the floor and, as the Christmas story is told, all the characters' gingerbread biscuits are decorated with icing and sprinkles. A jelly baby Jesus is laid in the manger, and everything is carefully glued with icing into a cardboard sandwich platter. Songs and worship are followed by tea.

'It's a really fantastic way of bringing the Christmas story to life' says Priory vicar, Rod Corke. 'And the excitement as they take their Gingerbread Nativities home to show and tell others is wonderful.'

New Archdeacon of Worcester - Mark Badger

Mark Badger is our new Archdeacon of Worcester following the retirement of Archdeacon Robert in November. As Archdeacon, Mark will have oversight of parishes and clergy in the four deaneries of Worcester, Malvern and Upton, Kidderminster and Stourport, and Pershore and Evesham. He will also have responsibility for our diocesan priority to double the number of children and young people in our churches by 2030 and support parishes in their ministry to new housing developments.

Mark said: "I was humbled and honoured to be asked to become the next Archdeacon of Worcester. I hope that I can continue Archdeacon Robert's work in being a pastor to the people in the Archdeaconry, helping them to feel loved and listened to and enabling them to continue to grow in their relationship with God and each other. Sunday 7 JANUARY**Epiphany****Epiphany**

The season of joyful celebration that began at Christmas now continues through the successive Sundays of Epiphany. The Feast of the Epiphany, which always falls on 6 January, marks the beginning of a season which celebrates certain key events in which Jesus' identity is revealed.'

Beginning with the visit of the magi, the Church goes on to remember the baptism of Christ, when a voice from heaven declares Jesus to be God's beloved Son. The season ends on 2 February with the Feast of the Presentation. Here Jesus is brought to the Temple in accordance with the law of Israel. There he is recognised and is declared to be 'a light to lighten the Gentiles and the glory of God's people Israel.' The traditional service for this feast includes a procession of candles, and so it is often known as Candlemas.

The word 'epiphany' means 'manifestation' or 'appearance', and the Feast of the Epiphany marks the recognition of the newborn Jesus by the world. This makes the season of Epiphanytide an apt time to pray for the worldwide mission of the Church.

Bronze Eco Diocese

We are now a bronze Eco Diocese, which is a key part of our journey towards net-zero carbon by 2030.

To achieve the diocesan Bronze Award, 5% of our churches needed to have achieved at least Bronze, along with the diocesan office itself. At the time of the award 22 churches had achieved a Bronze award with a further 17 achieving a Silver award. In total this was almost 15% of our churches.

Bishop Martin said: "I'm delighted that we are now a Bronze Eco Diocese and am grateful to all those who have worked hard to help us achieve it. However, we are not stopping here. The diocesan synod has committed to a pathway towards being net-zero Carbon by 2030 and we will be continuing to work on how we can achieve this, encouraging everyone in the Diocese to play their part. As more churches get involved in the Eco Church award scheme, hopefully it won't be too long before we can achieve a Silver Award!"



This annual event provides a focus on the work of the Christian ecumenical charity, Church Action on Poverty (CAP), encouraging prayer and learning about the roots of poverty in our country. This year the theme is, 'Dreamers that Do', with resources for worship, prayer and action available from www.church-poverty.org.uk/sunday. This includes the stories of people like Ashleigh who experienced poverty growing up in London but has found her voice through CAP: "I did not realise I had power within me to make a difference in society. But that has changed."

'Dignity, Agency, Power' is the core of CAPs strategy – campaigning that all may be afforded human dignity, given the agency to control their own lives, and the power to bring about social, political, and economic change. Its work involves listening to, and enabling, the voices of those who know about poverty because they experience it. Your Local Pantry is one CAP programme which seeks to achieve this. Pantries are food clubs, not food banks, run by the people who use them and hosted by churches. They aim to improve food access and create new friendships and stronger communities.

Kingdom Arts is a new worshipping community meeting on the second Tuesday of the month at St Georges', Worcester. Described by some as "Like Messy Church but for adults", the group has 40 regular attendees, with some travelling as far from Redditch and Birmingham to attend.

Each month the doors open for coffee, followed by a time of worship which includes a mix of traditional hymns and modern worship songs. The theme is introduced, as well as the available activities. The group then have time to create while they sit together and chat. Everyone then re-gathers, sharing what they have made if they wish and are invited to feedback on what they made and what God might be saying to them. The session ends with a prayer and sung blessing, before a shared lunch of homemade soup, bread, cheese, and cakes.

Praying for Growth - Children & Young People

We are aiming to double the number of children and young people in our churches by 2030.

Three churches in Worcester have worked together to apply to the Healthier Churches Fund and appoint a full-time Children and Youth Worker who will be shared between them. The Worcester parishes of St John the Baptist, St Stephen and St George jointly applied for Healthier Churches funding, which, alongside a small amount of top up funding from each of the churches, has been enough to create this full-time post for at least five years. Former CYD Mission Enabler, Helen Laird successfully applied for the post and started in Autumn.

Diocesan Children & Youth Adviser, Simon Hill said: "It's wonderful that these three churches in Worcester realised working together to gain funding was their best option and have been able to do this effectively to create this important role. Helen joins a growing network of employed youth and children's workers around the Diocese who prayerfully support each other to grow God's kingdom."

Praying for Growth - Investing in renewal

Holy Week

Holy Week begins with the re-enactment of Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. The procession with palms, which was already observed in Jerusalem in the fourth century, is accompanied by the reading of the Passion Narrative, in which the whole story of the week is anticipated.

Maundy Thursday includes the themes of humble Christian service expressed through Christ's washing of his disciples' feet, as well as the institution of the Eucharist. In preparation for the vigil the church is stripped of decoration.

After keeping vigil, Thursday passes into Good Friday. The sequence of meditations and music known as the Three Hours' Devotion was introduced into the Church of England in the nineteenth century. The church remains stripped of all decoration. It continues bare and empty through the following day, with silence as the best way to recall the death of Jesus. But within the silence there grows a sense of peace and completion, and then rising excitement as the Easter Vigil draws near.

This season preserves some of the oldest texts still in use and recalls the deepest and most fundamental Christian memories. Through participation in the whole sequence of services during Holy Week, we share in Christ's own journey, from the triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday to the empty tomb on Easter morning.

Thur 28 | Maundy Thursday

God our Father, you have invited us to share in the supper which your Son gave to his Church to proclaim his death until he comes: may he nourish us by his presence, and unite us in his love; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Fri 29 | Good Friday

Eternal God, in the cross of Jesus we see the cost of our sin and the depth of your love: in humble hope and fear may we place at his feet all that we have and all that we are, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Sat 30 | Retired clergy in Redditch & Bromsgrove

We pray for our retired clergy and their families in the Redditch and Bromsgrove Deanery, thankful for all that they have given and continue to give. We pray for their continued journey of faith, mindful of new challenges they may be facing in retirement. May God's blessing and peace be upon them.
