Although we sent a brief email yesterday about the DfE's update on RSHE, there are a few additional things that I would like to bring to your attention before the weekend.


The following **DfE updates**, including some on governance, might be helpful.

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- Advance notice - please save **the morning of Friday 23 October** to join us at our first ever online conference. Entitled 'Never the Same', we will be joined on Zoom by a number of speakers including Bishop Martin Gorick, Professor Barry Carpenter (the UK's only Professor of Mental Health and Wellbeing in Education), and Andy Wolfe from the CEEO. The conference will address issues relating to recovery, reigniting learning, and dealing with grief and loss. We have rescheduled our normal annual headteacher conference for the summer term 2021 (details later) but we wanted to gather with you in the Autumn term and explore some of the more pressing issues as you navigate what are uncharted waters for us all. - **Navigate**
 - 'Navigate' is a post-lockdown emotional resilience and wellbeing resource for primary schools from 'Imagine For Schools' that consists of 6 x 1 hour sessions and that has been recommended by our colleagues in the Diocese of Gloucester. Each session is easy to follow and is facilitated by a series of bitesize videos that run alongside teacher-led activities with accompanying 'Navigate' worksheets. Each session also includes a short training video for the class teacher. The 6 sessions are:
 - Exploring Emotions...
 - Lockdown Life Picture...
 - Peak To Peak - Dealing With Challenge
 - Dealing With Emotions...
 - Life Through A Lens...
 - In it together - Reconnecting...
