Theme: God made everything

Genesis 1:28

"Be responsible for fish in the sea and birds in the air, for every living thing that moves on the face of the earth"

Theme exploration:

The Bible says God created the world, and every living creature that lives in it. You may wish to read the story of creation or watch it here: https://youtu.be/teu7BCZTgD

The creation story can be found in most children's Bibles and is usually the first story. God made each fish, bird and every living thing, and at the end of each day He said that 'it was good', so God didn't need to send anything back. Because everything God has created is good, God wants us to take care of everything for Him.

As a family this month you could:

- Make a pretend zoo with your toys.
- Visit a zoo, safari park or a pet shop. How many different animals can you see? How different are they, for example are they all furry?
- Go on your own bug safari.
- Go to the library and look at or borrow a book about animals.
- Can you think of an animal for every letter of the alphabet?
- Make your own animals out of empty boxes, maybe even create a brand new animal. What would it eat, where would it live, can it fly or swim?
- Which is your favourite animal why?
