


Different Ways of Praying

This is the first in a series from the diocesan Spirituality group, which will explore a particular way of praying. Each prayer diary will have an introduction like this, and then three Sundays (not quite one a month) suggesting a way of using this form of prayer. We begin with a type of prayer that comes to us particularly from Eastern Orthodox tradition, usually known as the Jesus Prayer. It is also sometimes referred to as the Prayer of the Heart. A lot of Western Christians were first introduced to it by a 19th century Russian classic "The Way of a Pilgrim" (available in Penguin Classics, translated by Andrew Louth.)

There are several versions of the prayer. A common one is **"Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner."** This echoes some New Testament stories. In St Luke's gospel, Jesus tells the story of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector (Luke 18:9-14). In this, Jesus commends the Tax Collector and his prayer: "God be merciful to me, a sinner." St Mark tells the story of blind Bartimaeus (Mark 10:46-52), who calls out repeatedly "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me." Mercy, sometimes translated loving-kindness, is the fundamental thing we seek from God. This prayer puts that front and centre.

A lot of the teaching about this prayer also ties it both to what St John's gospel says about praying "in Jesus's name" and St Paul's instruction to the Thessalonians to "pray without ceasing" (1 Thess 5:17). Orthodox spiritual writers talk about how repeated use of this phrase helps prayer sink deep into the heart. At times of distraction, worry or anxiety, returning to a simple repeated phrase can bring the person back to a sense of God's loving presence.



We will look at ways of using this prayer on 27 April, 25 May and 20 July.



Mothering is a strange word...other than as a title for this 4th Sunday of Lent, the most common use is probably a negative one "Oh stop mothering me!" It can be aimed at anyone – man, woman or non-binary. It isn't someone's gender that indicates whether or not they can 'mother' another person, it is their propensity for caring.

Even according to the Collins Dictionary, the definition for the verb to mother, doesn't mention women... it says 'to treat someone with great care and affection, to nurture, to protect or to raise'.

As Christians we are raised in our faith and in this regard, many Christians owe as much to their church community as to their physical parents – maybe more. Rooted in gratitude and love, Mothering Sunday reminds us of God's tender care, often reflected in the selfless love of mother figures in our lives. In Isaiah 66:13, God says, "As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you." This image reassures us of the deep, unconditional love that God has for each of us.

Today we pray for all the mothering figures in our lives, particularly for those who helped to shape our faith journey. We hope that we can help others grow in faith and share your good news.

Diocesan Lent Appeal

This year's Lent Appeal is supporting the newly created Morogoro Bible College Scholarship Fund.

This fund has been set up by members of our diocesan Morogoro Partnership group to support the costs of tuition and board for catechists, evangelists and pastors from the mission parishes across our link Diocese of Morogoro in Tanzania.

The Revd Katryn Leclezio visited the College when she was in Morogoro. She said: "Many students come from rural areas where they are involved in planting new churches in predominantly non-Christian areas. They are required to pay their own fees from the lands which they till. Drought caused by climate

change over the last few years has made it increasingly difficult for students to pay sufficient for their education."

Morogoro Bible College is the Anglican Training Centre for the Diocese of Morogoro. It has six members of staff and four programmes are offered to 70 students with only two classrooms.

Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week, the most solemn and sacred time in the Christian calendar. On this day, we remember Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, where crowds welcomed him with palm branches, shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" (Mark 11:9).

Sunday 13 APRIL

This moment of celebration, however, is bittersweet. The same voices that praised Jesus would soon call for his crucifixion. Palm Sunday invites us to reflect on the nature of our own discipleship. Do we follow Jesus only in times of joy, or do we remain faithful even in trials?

As we hold palm crosses in our hands, we are reminded that Christ's path of kingship led to the cross. His victory was not one of earthly power, but of sacrificial love. Through his suffering, death, and resurrection, he opened the way for our salvation.

As Holy Week begins, let us walk with Jesus in prayer and reflection, preparing our hearts to receive the fullness of his love and grace at Easter.

True and humble king, hailed by the crowd as Messiah: grant us the faith to know you and love you, that we may be found beside you on the way of the cross, which is the path of glory.

Easter Day

In this period of Easter – a time of new life and new starts, we pray for those who may be considering whether God is calling them to become our next Bishop of Worcester. Help them to hear your voice as they prayerfully explore this role.

Using the Jesus Prayer

Repetition is fundamental to using the Jesus Prayer (see the introduction at the start of this prayer diary).

One fundamental way of doing this is to link it to our breathing. Ideally find somewhere

where you can sit or kneel with your back upright. A straight back is a remarkable aid to prayer. A prayer stool, or a firm upright chair often help. Then breathe in slowly, and slowly let your breath out again. Pay attention to your breathing, becoming aware of the air coming in, and going out.

Then join the words of the prayer to the movement of your breath. As you breathe in, think, or say in your head, "Lord Jesus Christ", as you breathe out, think "Son of God"; breath in again, saying in your head "have mercy on me" and breathe out, thinking "a sinner." Repeat this process, keeping the words in rhythm with your breathing.

Perhaps, initially, you might like to begin your prayer with a couple of minutes of doing this, but over time use it more. Perhaps praying like this for five minutes might be a good way to prepare for corporate worship. Over time you may find yourself wanting to use it more.

Silver Eco Church for Great Malvern Priory

Last year, Great Malvern Priory achieved their Silver Eco Church Award.

The work was led by the Priory Environmental Group, who looked at every aspect of Priory life from an eco-perspective. They have continued many of the things put in place to achieve their Bronze award in 2022, including articles in the Priory magazine to raise awareness of environmental issues, and an Environment Group tip of the month on the weekly notice sheet to encourage ethical or sustainable behaviour.

To achieve Silver, the group has also strengthened the Priory's eco credentials in other ways. They have worked with the local council to establish a wildflower area in the churchyard, developed a Land Management Plan, built a bug hotel, introduced a sustainable flower policy for the flower arrangers and organised

a Book and Games Swap. They have also made sure to include the wider congregation with an annual Environment Day service.

The group are now encouraging the Buildings and Grounds Committee to consider the possibilities of generating renewable energy on their premises.

Vocations Sunday

Praying with the Jesus Prayer

You will often see Eastern Orthodox Christians wearing a bracelet made of woollen (sometimes wooden) beads. In the Eastern tradition, using the Jesus Prayer (see the introduction at the start of the prayer diary) is often accompanied by using a prayer rope. This is a cord with a fixed number of knots (or beads), often 33 or 100.

Traditionally each knot is woven out of several cross shaped turns. Many Orthodox Christians wear them as a reminder of St Paul's injunction to "pray without ceasing" (1 Thess 5:17). At various times in the day, or at times they need to be focussed, they will begin to move their fingers over the knots. On each knot they pray one repetition of the Jesus Prayer.

This has a lot in common with the Catholic tradition of praying the rosary: it is using a physical prop to help a simple repeated prayer sink down from the head to the heart. Having something to do with our hands turns moments we might otherwise simply fidget about with our fingers into an opportunity to recall ourselves to the presence of God and God's grace.

Why not experiment with a prayer rope, a set of beads or a rosary this month, using the Jesus Prayer, and see if that helps you?

Praying the Jesus Prayer

One of the ways many churches celebrate the continuing presence of Christ in his Church is by keeping the Sacrament reserved in a tabernacle or aumbry (a special cupboard) in the church. This is not something all Christians do or agree with, but many people find it a helpful physical focus for prayer, and a reminder that God comes to us, first in the physical flesh of Jesus, and today in the physical elements of the consecrated bread and wine of the Eucharist.



Using the Jesus Prayer (see the introduction at the start of this prayer diary) can be a helpful way of attending to the presence of Christ in his church, either by sitting simply in church, or very specifically sitting before Jesus in his Blessed Sacrament. As we recollect the presence of Jesus with us, we can attend to him more fully by praying repeatedly the words "Lord Jesus Christ, Son

of God, have mercy on me, a sinner." Mercy – God's loving-kindness – is at the heart of the Sacrament, and the heart of God's relationship with us. If you pass an open church on your summer holidays, why not go in and pray?

In this prayer diary, we're praying for the deaneries of Worcester and Kidderminster & Stourport

Worcester Deanery encompasses a large area spanning both the eastern and western sides of the River Severn. Serving a population of 149,405, it includes the city of Worcester and the historic Spa town of Droitwich. The deanery consists of 28 parishes with 37 churches located in areas of varying affluence across urban, suburban and rural contexts. The presence of the Cathedral and All Saints Resourcing Church located in the city centre enrich the deanery.



Kidderminster and Stourport Deanery encompasses both rural and urban areas of Worcestershire stretching from the borders of Herefordshire in the West to Droitwich in the South-East. A deanery restructuring process still being finalised has created more distinct rural and urban parishes better able to support one another. In the West of the deanery, we are developing a collegiate group working across a large rural area covering 26 churches. This 'Muddy Boots' mission area seeks to relish being rural Christians, sharing the joys and challenges that life in the countryside brings. We hope and pray our learning can inform and inspire others.
