



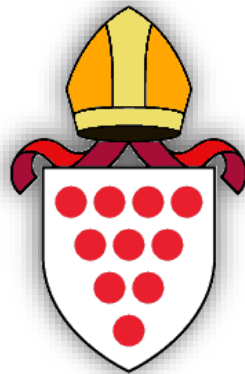

Ministry and Leadership	<p>YouthScape Essentials Course Starting 5 March for 10 weeks, 19.00 – 21.00 5th, 12th, 19th March and 9th April to 21st May</p> <p>Youthscape Essentials is an innovative course for volunteers and paid youth leaders that increases your skills and understanding about working alongside young people today. Whether you're running a community project, a church youth group, or occasionally helping out on a Sunday morning, the course is designed with you in mind! Finance and Administration	<p>Lunchtime Learning - The Examen 12 March, 12:30 – 13:30</p> <p>Led by Helen Stanton</p> <p>When laid up in bed convalescing after a bad war wound, the future St Ignatius started to realise that he felt changed by reading lives of saints in ways he was not be reading romantic adventures. Out of that realisation he developed a whole approach to spirituality which above all he put into his Spiritual Exercises.</p> <p>One of the key disciplines that he developed as part of that is known as the Examen (the normal Spanish word for exam). This refers to a reflection, usually undertaken near the end of the day, that recalls the past day, and tries to notice what was going on, where God was, and where the person was moving more towards or away from, the presence of God. There are several different versions of how to do this, still sharing the same broad approach.</p> <p>In this lunchtime learning session, Helen Stanton will explore how we can make the most of the Examen as a regular spiritual discipline. She is particularly focussed on doing this a positive exercise about growing our relationship with God, and avoiding the common danger of using it as a way of beating ourselves up for mistakes.</p> <p>Helen Stanton is the Warden of Holland House, and a lay theologian. She has trained lay and ordained people for ministry, most recently at the Queen's Foundation, Birmingham. Enrichment	<p>Lunchtime Learning - Reading Ruth 23 April, 12:30 – 13:30</p> <p>Led by the Rev'd Becky Elliott, Dean of Women's Ministry</p> <p>There are three books of the Bible (including the Apocrypha) that are named after their heroines: Ruth, Esther and Judith. This summer, our lunchtime learning sessions are on these three books, among the lesser known texts of the Bible.</p> <p>Ruth is one of the shortest books in the Old Testament. For Jews, it's in the third section of their Bibles, the Writings. Christians classify it as among the historical books, and place it between the books of Judges and Samuel. This appears to be roughly when it is set, a distant past for the author, who describes the customs of the period for an audience which doesn't know them. Nikki Groarke, Archdeacon of Dudley</p> <p>There are three books of the Bible (including the Apocrypha) that are named after their heroines: Ruth, Esther and Judith. This summer, our lunchtime learning sessions are on these three books, among the lesser known texts of the Bible.</p> <p>The book of Esther comes in two editions. Depending on your Bible you may have copies of both! There’s one version in the Old Testament, translating the original Hebrew text, which famously doesn’t mention God, and a longer Greek version in the Apocrypha which explicitly puts God into the story. The story of Esther is the basis of the Jewish feast of Purim, and is set at a time when the Persian empire was at its height. Ministry and Leadership	<p>Apologetics – Invitation to a Book Club 23 May, 12:30 – 13:30</p> <p>The first letter of Peter tells us: “Always be prepared to give an account of the hope that is in you.” (1 Pet 3:15) However, we – clergy and lay people alike – get very little training in how to give either a defence of our faith to those who attack it, or how to offer reasonable explanation of it to those who are confused about what we believe. This is the discipline traditionally known as apologetics, from the Latin <i>apologia</i> – defence.</p> <p>This is an invitation to a meeting, convened by Doug Chaplin, about forming a book club (or if you prefer more academic framing, a seminar) to read and reflect on Alister McGrath’s new book, <i>Christian Apologetics: An Introduction</i> (Wiley Blackwell, 2023). This preliminary meeting will be mainly to gauge interest, and if there is sufficient interest, set up a group, probably meeting fortnightly (perhaps monthly) on Zoom, and for 9 further sessions – giving one session per chapter.</p> <p>This seminar might be of particular interest to clergy and Licensed Lay Ministers, but is open to everyone. Participants will need their own copy of the book. You will get more out of, however, if you have at least done the Bishop’s Certificate course. Enrichment	<p>Getting to know the book of Judith 12.30pm – 1.30pm (date to be confirmed)</p> <p>Led by the Canon Kimberly Bohan, Canon Librarian of Worcester Cathedral</p> <p>There are three books of the Bible (including the Apocrypha) that are named after their heroines: Ruth, Esther and Judith. This summer, our lunchtime learning sessions are on these three books, among the lesser known texts of the Bible.</p> <p>Written a hundred or so years before the time of Jesus, the book of Judith is a piece of imaginative fiction we now have in the Apocrypha. Set in the time of the Assyrian Empire, it tells a story of the empire invading Israel. Judith demands that the leaders of her town show some faith in God, and resist the invading forces. When the men refuse to act, Judith takes matters</p>

into her own hands, and the actions lead to Israelite victory. It is one of the biblical stories that has attracted feminist interpreters, in the way it portrays a bold and faithful woman taking effective action where the men have been both timid and unwilling or unable to trust in God. Judith provides an example of both faith and courage.

Come and find out more about this relatively obscure story, which has given rise to a number of famous paintings. The Canon Librarian of Worcester Cathedral, Kimberly Bohan, will lead our exploration of the story.

	For whom: this workshop, originally arranged as part of the LLM continuing ministerial development programme, is open to all who preach, clergy as well as Readers.	
	In Advent 2024 the church begins the final year of its three year cycle of readings with St Luke's gospel providing the focus for the year. This workshop is being run over a morning, beginning with refreshments at 10.00am and moving to learning at 10.30am. A slightly shortened version of the learning is being presented online in the evening.	
	St Luke's gospel is many people's favourite gospel, and that reflects his skill as a storyteller, who is also more interested than the other gospel writers in the short stories Jesus tells. Famous and much loved parables like the story of the prodigal son and the good Samaritan only occur in Luke's gospel. Luke also pays quite a lot attention to themes of money and possessions, shows us more of Jesus at prayer, and generally makes women more visible in his story. He is also, of course, the only gospel writer to write a sequel!	
Ministry and Leadership	Doug Chaplin, Discipleship and Lay Training Officer, will reflect with those attending on Luke as someone seeking to preach on it over the coming year. This will include ways informed by recent trends in biblical criticism, and addressing the contexts in which we read scripture to inform our individual and corporate following of Jesus today. What are some of the emphases Luke brings to our relationship with Jesus that we can draw out in our preaching through the coming year?
