In this prayer diary, we're praying for the deaneries of Malvern & Upton and Pershore & Evesham

Malvern and Upton Deanery is contained by the rivers Severn and Teme, by the M5/M50/A38 triangle and the majestic Malvern Hills. As well as two tourist towns, the deanery is an eclectic mix of expanding new housing and quaint rural villages, farms and agri-economy, places for concerts and places for festivals, walking trails, traveller sites and a few stately homes.



Pershore and Evesham is a deanery of 69 churches, with two towns, many villages and hamlets. In many places, people still identify with the local church building and their community even though most commute for work, school and recreation. We have two large towns with further housing planned, including three major strategic housing developments which will add an additional 16,000 homes.

Throughout this prayer diary, the diocesan Spirituality group will help us to explore a particular way of praying.




Using mantra for prayer

Following on from the introduction to using silence as prayer in the last edition, one very understandable question may be, how do I attain silence? Silence isn't being in a place where there's little or no sound – if that were the case most people would rarely be able to pray. Silence is not the absence of sound, but the space that holds all sound – it's the 'substratum' of life itself. That's why all spiritual traditions, Christianity included, know it's the space where the deepest intimacy of God can be experienced.

The noisiest place on the planet is... our mind! What a lot of 'traffic' is whirring, whispering, chuntering and generally churning around our minds. Even if we find an externally quiet place to pray, we bring the noise in with us.

Mantra offers us a toolset to help quieten the internal noise, and it can be very effective. Mantra literally means an instrument, tool or that which protects the mind. We'll be looking at just three types of mantra in the course of this edition of the prayer diary, but don't just read about these – try them out! You've only got a lot of noise to lose.

Christmas singing in Halesowen

An exciting new singing group is beginning today at St John the Baptist Church in Halesowen. Initially meeting once each month, Joyful Noise is aimed at children and young people who enjoy singing and want to flourish in faith through song.

Using mantra for prayer - First practice

The first mantra is the well-known Orthodox prayer, "The Jesus Prayer".

Often accompanied using a 'prayer-rope' (a small, knotted rope, with each knot held in turn as the prayer is repeated). However, you can use a rosary or even your fingers - just touch each one in turn. Or don't use any physical support, saying the mantra until you naturally stop.

"Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me a sinner".

Repeat the line holding the knot, bead, touching a finger, or just pause at the end. Then allow a gentle inhale and say it again, moving onto the next knot, bead, finger etc).

Focus intently on the words, each one as you say them (it's best to whisper the words to begin with). Don't rush this - you'll not encounter intimacy if you do.

You may end up praying just one of the words, 'Lord' or 'Jesus' or even 'of God'. That's perfect, the word that sticks is a doorway for you. Another outcome might be you forget the words entirely, at least any meaning, and let the rhythm and sound move you.

Second Practice

Having discovered mantra and the Jesus Prayer, we'll move on to a prayer made popular by Fr John Main. This mantra is very short, just a single word. As before, it's simply repeated using a prayer rope etc, or just our breath.

The mantra is maranatha.

When praying it whisper the word like this; ma-ra-na-tha.

Say the prayer by emphasising each syllable, ma...ra...na...tha. Then take a gentle in-breath and say it again, ma...ra...na...tha. Focus on the sound, how it feels on the lips, tongue, mouth.

Give it all of your attention. The prayer corrals the mind, rounding it up and focussing it. If it escapes (it will, by remembering something, anything!) gently bring it back into line by pausing and starting afresh.

Maranatha can be found in the Bible at 1 Corinthians 16:22. It's one of the few Aramaic words untranslated into Greek and means, "Our Lord has come / is coming". Sadly, it seems to be used by St Paul as a curse, but don't let that put you off!

Own the word for yourself, don't dwell on particular meanings, but use the sound and texture of the word to focus your mind in the direction of silence.

Holocaust Memorial Day

Holocaust Memorial Day takes place each year on 27 January and encourages remembrance in a world scarred by genocide.

The Holocaust is central to the commemoration, and we remember the six million Jewish men, women and children who were murdered. 27 January marks the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi death camp.



On Holocaust Memorial Day, we also commemorate the millions more people murdered through the Nazi persecution of other groups, as well as the genocides in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur. A United Nations commission of inquiry has also highlighted genocide committed in Gaza.

Our world often feels fragile and vulnerable, and we cannot be complacent. Wherever it takes place, prejudice and the language of hatred must be challenged by us all.

Candlemas

Candlemas, celebrated on 2 February, marks a beautiful turning point in the Church's year - the moment we look back to the light of Christmas and forward toward the shadows of Lent. It recalls the day when Mary and Joseph brought the infant Jesus to the Temple, where Simeon and Anna recognised him as the promised light to the nations.

Third Practice
