D Theme exploration:

Jesus disciples didn't know how to talk/pray to God. So, Jesus teaches them 'The Lord's Prayer'. In this prayer we see that Jesus shows us how to talk to God as a Father. In other words, Jesus is telling us that we can greet God by saying 'Hello Daddy'. We are invited to chat to God with complete trust and openness. Do you talk to God either in your hearts or out loud?

In the Bible God, our heavenly Father is sometimes described as a shepherd of a flock of sheep (John10:11-18), or as a mother (Psalm 17:8). These images of father, shepherd and mother show God's love and care for us. Do we love God in return?

A six your old once said 'when your dad is his very goodest, he's just a little bit like God'* – God is the perfect parent to us all. Prayer is talking to God just like children and parents talk to each other.

Things for you to try this month:

- Read the Lord's Prayer from the Bible found in Matthew 6:9-13.
- Play the card game happy families.
- Play Simon says, but the commands should only be followed when you say 'Dad says' or 'Mum says'.
- Draw a prayer by drawing things you love in one colour and things that make you sad in another colour.
- Draw a family tree don't forget to put God right at the top.
- Go on an adventure (a walk outside) just like in our story today.
