Biblical link	Why it matters	All Christians believe that God created the universe. At the start of creation, God brought order out of chaos by speaking aloud and bringing all things into existence. God named parts of nature, this shows God's authority over creation. In the final part of creation, God made humans in His image, and he was very pleased with His creation. On the seventh day He rested. God created the world and brought us into existence so that we can share in His overflowing love, goodness and creativity. When we look at nature, we can feel close to God who created it. Nature can be aweinspiring and also dangerous.	%
