Theme Introduction:

Adults can often under value imaginative play. Play is a child's way of engaging with and making sense of the world. Role play may appear to be a very simple activity, yet within it, young children learn practical life skills such as decision making, dressing themselves, how to cooperate and share with others.

Theme exploration:

Our imagination helps us to learn and understand more about God through the Bible and of the world He created. Jesus often told stories where listeners had to use their imaginations e.g. the parables.

Free play suggestion:


Link with book:

- Shaving foam, on a table or in large containers. Cars can drive, planes can fly through the clouds.
- Mega blocks connect the blocks together, like we are connected to God.
