Theme Introduction:

Being courageous is sometimes a difficult thing for both adults and children to do. Today we are thinking about how as Christians we get through difficult times. We know that God is with us and helps us.

In this story the family go on a journey. They are hunting for a bear, they travel through mud, long grass and water. So, they need to be brave.

We will all have obstacles in life to overcome. For Christians we know that the Bible tells us that God goes before us. Being a Christian doesn't mean everything will be easy. Knowing God is with us helps us in those tricky times of life, so that we can be courageous.

Theme exploration:

To be courageous we need someone to trust. Christians choose to trust in God. Who do you trust?

Free play suggestion:

Link with book:

• Provide 3 bowls each with a different texture in eq water, Rice Krispies and shredded paper. Encourage children to put their feet or hands in it.

I wonder what do the different things feel like.

- Provide some toy animals for the children to play with.
- Hide a teddy bear somewhere in your room. Encourage children to find it and then leave it there for others to find.

Craft ideas:

Link with Book

- Paint footprints.
- Have a piece of A3 paper, paint the child's feet and ask them to walk along the paper to make footprints.

• Provide brown playdough to model bears.
