Opposition Arguments (Most Common)

- **Biblical Authority**: Frequent citations of specific scriptures (Leviticus 18:22, Romans 1:24-27, Genesis)
- Doctrinal Concerns: Belief that LLF contradicts established Church doctrine
- Process Criticism: Claims that proper synodical procedures weren't followed
- **Unity Concerns**: Fear that LLF will cause irreparable division in the Church
- **Slippery Slope**: Worry that blessing same-sex relationships will lead to same-sex marriage

Support Arguments

- Love and Inclusion: Emphasis on Jesus's message of love for all people
- **Human Dignity**: Recognition of LGBTQ+ individuals as full members of God's creation
- Modern Understanding: References to contemporary knowledge of human sexuality
- **Delayed Justice**: Frustration with the slow pace of change
