Stepping out of comfort zones



In the film 'Madagascar' we meet a bunch of 'wild' animals in a zoo. They live the life of luxury, they are fed and groomed and adored by people. One day Marty (the Zebra) realises there is something missing. Marty can't shake the feeling that he was meant for something more than the life he has at the zoo. We see this restlessness result in the whole gang ending up in Madagascar- the true wild. Where they suddenly must fend for themselves and live truly 'wildly'- as nature intended.

I wonder if Jesus looks at Christians and churches sometimes like this. We have got so used to living in comfort, never having to step out of our comfort zones, but perhaps, realistically Jesus intended us to live a much broader life. We see in the Bible the disciples going from place to place (most of the time to places they weren't welcome) telling people about Jesus, healing people from sickness and death, being beaten up and imprisoned and killed for these actions. But we never read that the disciples regretted it. I wonder if they felt they had lived their lives open and free as God had intended.

As Christians, we are called to be brave and step out and do the things that others won't. How often do you feel you are living like this?
