The tale of Robin Hood is hundreds of years old and has been retold many times. The Robin Hood in this 2019 film depicts the character of Robin Hood with a compassion for other people. This can be seen in the early scenes where Robin of Loxley, who is reluctantly fighting in the crusades, takes a huge risk to save the life of a fellow soldier who is wounded and then takes a further risk to save the life of a prisoner of war. This compassion carries on into the film as he steals from the rich to give to the poor.

This film reminds us of the time when Jesus turned the tables over in the temple. Jesus did this because of a number of issues. The people buying sacrifices needed to change their roman coins into temple coins and they were not given the correct exchange value. Also, the scales were rigged so that when offerings were weighed they were charged too much. This was unjust and Jesus acted against it.
