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# Foreword from the Diocesan Director of Education (DDE)

On behalf of the Worcester Diocesan Board of Education, we are pleased to present this year's **Training and Support Service Level Agreement (TSSLA)** – a comprehensive package of support and professional development opportunities for you and your school team.

We have once again refreshed and expanded our offer to meet the evolving needs of our church schools, with the aim of supporting the flourishing of all children and adults within your communities. As always, we are honoured to work alongside you in realising your Christian vision in your school's unique and special context.

#### This document outlines:

- The core services available to all church schools, and
- The **enhanced support** accessible through membership of the TSSLA.

Our full suite of SIAMS-related training courses have been revised to reflect our insights from last year's inspections and the findings from The Annual Report of the National Director of SIAMS.

We continue to prioritise the mental health and wellbeing of school leaders, recognising the demands of educational leadership. We have refined our offer this year, prioritising opportunities for retreat days, on-site support for school communities in need or crisis and on-going senior leader support. We have introduced termly video reflections to provide leaders with helpful strategies to support the mental health and wellbeing of staff throughout the academic year.

We hope these opportunities provide meaningful and restorative support for you and your leadership teams.

Schools purchasing the SLA continue to be entitled to 15 hours of bespoke onsite support. We encourage early booking and suggest collaborating with cluster or MAT schools with similar priorities to maximise the impact of these hours.

Governance remains a key focus. Our governance training has been reviewed and updated, with a greater focus on compliance. For schools seeking more tailored governance development, our **Enhanced Governance Support SLA** remains available. You may use your 15 hours from the TSSLA to access this support or purchase it separately.

Our training and support services are open to everyone in your school community – from Early Career Teachers and class teachers to aspiring leaders, senior leaders, headteachers, clergy, and governors. All are warmly welcome!

We look forward to partnering with you in the year ahead and deeply value your continued commitment to the children and young people in your school communities.

# Meet the Diocesan Education Team



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# Entitlement of all Schools and Academies

Core Services are available to all church schools and academies at no cost and irrespective of membership of the Training & Support Service Level Agreement (SLA).

Core services are designed to support all of our schools' and academies' deeply Christian character. The entitlement of all schools and academies includes:

- basic telephone or email advice and support as required, from 9am-4pm, Monday to Friday (please see page 2 for contact details)
- regular information and resources from the Education Team via electronic mailings and the diocesan website
- · attendance at the termly headteachers' briefings
- attendance at the termly governors' and governance professionals' (clerks') briefings
- places at governor-specific training events listed in the Diocesan Training & Support SLA
   Training Schedule
- administration and support with foundation governor/director appointments
- a diocesan Keeping in Touch (KiT) meeting an annual meeting with a member of the Education
   Team to discuss your school's current context and priorities
- telephone or support advice pre and post SIAMS and Ofsted inspection
- conversation with SIAMS or Ofsted Inspectors during their visit
- attendance at SIAMS and Ofsted feedback by a member of the Education Team
- attendance and support through headteacher appointment processes (interview day, preparation meetings and materials)
- · attendance at a two-day training course for newly appointed headteachers
- attendance at a one-day training course for those who are new to teaching in a church school
- attendance at a one-day training course for Early Career Teachers (ECTs)
- attendance at a one-day training course for net zero carbon awareness
- school organisation advice and support (academisation and collaboration, change of age range, etc.)
- pastoral support
- chaplaincy advice and development with local clergy
- · advice on issues related to church school property, site ownership and trust deed
- advice about school land and building issues
- access to the Church and School Partnership Award
- access to RE Subject Leader update meetings three times a year
- access to RE moderation sessions.

## **Service Charter**

Those schools and academies within our diocese are entitled to expect members of the Diocesan Education Team to:

- · have a pastoral concern for the staff, governors and pupils of the school or academy
- · provide professional and expert information, advice and assistance
- · deliver the services listed, upon request, to a high standard
- respond promptly and courteously to requests for assistance
- · act with discretion and confidentiality
- · be responsive to individual schools and academies and their distinctive ethos
- act with integrity and in accordance with Christian beliefs and values
- promote at all times the Christian foundation and ethos of the school or academy
- · deal promptly and courteously with any complaints regarding the level of service provided
- represent the interests of Church of England schools and academies with partner Local Authorities (LAs), the Department for Education (DfE), Ofsted, Standard Advisory Councils for RE (SACREs), Regional Director, National Society for Education/the Church of England Education Office, and other appropriate bodies.

## In return, schools and academies are expected to:

- keep the Diocesan Education Team informed of any changes in relation to the service required
- keep the Diocesan Education Team informed of any developments at the school or academy
- return the school performance data and governance information data requests in a timely manner
- be available, given adequate notice, for meetings and / or visits
- give adequate and appropriate notice when requesting or postponing visits, meetings, training, etc. where possible giving at least 24 hours' notice for any cancellations
- · pay invoices promptly.

### **Complaints**

Any complaints should, in the first instance, be directed to the <u>Diocesan Director of Education</u>. The Diocesan Director of Education will arrange for another officer to investigate and respond. If the matter is not resolved at this stage, the issue will be referred to an appropriate member of the Diocesan Board of Education.

# **Charges**

In addition to the entitlement of all schools and academies detailed on page 3, schools are invited to buy additional services through this SLA. SLA schools and academies are entitled to access:

- all training courses set out in the Training Events Booking Form for an unlimited number of members of staff and / or the Governing Board
- the opportunity for up to two school leaders to attend our Headteachers' & Senior Leaders'
   Conference
- 15 hours of bespoke in-school support, detailed on pages 12-15
- Mental Health and Wellbeing Support for school leaders, detailed on pages 7-11. These are in addition to the 15 hours of bespoke in-school support.

### SLA charges for primary, first, and middle schools and academies are:

- for schools with up to 249 pupils: £6.00 per pupil
- for schools with 250-349 pupils: charged as above up to 249 pupils, plus £5.00 for each additional pupil
- for schools with 350 pupils or more: charged as above up to 349 pupils, plus £4.00 per additional pupil.

All charges per pupil remain unchanged from the previous Training & Support SLA.

There is an expectation that all schools within multi-academy trusts will purchase the Training & Support SLA.

Please note, all pupil numbers are based on those returned in the October 2024 School Census.

VAT will be charged at the standard rate, but will be recoverable by the school.


# Church and School Partnership Award



The Diocesan Board of Education encourages all 99 schools to regularly assess the joint work undertaken with the local church. The Church and School Partnership Award is a new award in our diocese. It is one way of recognising the exceptional work that churches and schools do together.



Part of the SIAMS Framework looks at the relationship that schools have with a range of stakeholders, including the local church. This award does not seek to replace SIAMS, but may give schools valuable evidence in how they live out their vision within the local community. This scheme looks to encourage both church and school to forge and maintain positive relationships and look at the ways in which they can flourish through becoming one community.





If you would like to discuss your application in anyway prior to applying for accreditation, please feel free to come to one of our termly workshops. Schools who have purchased the Training and Support SLA are also welcome to use their 15 hours of bespoke in-school support for a one-to-one session on this.

#### Who is Val Turner?

I was a teacher from 1972 to 1999 - with a few years in the 70's when I stayed at home to look after my babies. In 2000, I was ordained and I think it was in 2002 that Gloucester Education Department asked me to lead a headteachers' retreat day. Since then, I have worked with teachers and school leaders providing pastoral support and guidance, sometimes one-to-one, but also for groups as retreat days, INSET training, and teaching on the spiritual leadership of a school community.

When I was a vicar, I experienced the heavy weight of the relentless responsibility of being a leader. As a teacher, school governor and chaplain in a FE college, I came face-to-face with the challenges you engage with on a daily basis and I have immense respect and deep compassion for every one of you.

Since 2012, when I retired from parish ministry, I have opened my home to give pastoral support and spiritual direction. Most of my teaching was in the art department, so I often offer art in various guises because it is so powerfully therapeutic. In addition to ordination training and spiritual direction, I trained as a school counsellor and chaplain.

#### **Collective Worship Review**

The aim of this review is to support the school in making a judgement about the effectiveness of Collective Worship and provision for spiritual development. Areas that will be considered include:

- · creativity in the content and leading of worship
- · opportunities for prayer
- · children as leaders of worship
- support for worship from the local church

Where the school have a CREW or Collective Worship committee, a meeting with these children is useful to consider their role and its impact. By the end of the day a number of practical 'next steps' will have been established to enable the school to move forward.

#### **Spirituality Review**

The aim of this review is to support the school with spirituality around the school, including the curriculum. Areas that will be considered include:

- · the school's understanding of spirituality
- · evidence of spirituality across the curriculum
- · evidence of spirituality around the school
- a contextualised and coherent understanding of spiritual development across the school.

By the end of the day, a number of practical 'next steps' will have been established to enable the school to move forward.

#### **RE Subject Audit**

During this audit, meetings will be held with the RE Lead, link governor and pupils to discuss:

- · the profile of RE in both school and the community
- · implementation of the Agreed Syllabus
- implementation of 'ways of knowing' in RE
- · monitoring of teaching, learning and progress
- · the assessment of RE
- how governors monitor the effectiveness of RE
- how pupils express, develop and understand religious and non-religious concepts.

By the end of the day, a number of practical 'next steps' will have been established to enable the school to move forward. The day will also include a learning walk and book scrutiny.

#### **Website Check**

All schools are legally required to publish certain information on their website. Through the Level I website check, we look to see if schools and academies have published online what is legally required. We then provide each school with a checklist, identifying documents and information they have and those they need to provide to be compliant with DfE regulations.

The Level 2 website check encompasses the tasks carried out in the Level I check and also looks at the detail within the required documents and policies to ensure they are in date and the content meets statutory requirements. As well as providing a checklist to each school, a member of our team will also feedback to the headteacher or relevant member of staff by telephone or Teams meeting.

## **Statutory Policy Audit**

This audit supports schools in ensuring they have all statutory policies in place. Our audit uses the requirements outlined in the DfE's 'Maintained or Academy Trust Governance' guidance; however, our audit makes it simple to see which policies and documents apply specifically to your school. The audit outlines the list of the statutory policies and documents you must keep, who should sign them off, and when they must be reviewed. We will RAG rate your document to highlight any necessary action required. We can also provide templates for statutory policies and documents within the DfE guidance. They can then be adapted to suit your school's needs, Christian vision and values, and are compliant with the necessary statutory guidance.

#### Diocesan Review of Governance in a Church School

This review is offered as support to improve and develop governance. It will help your Governing Board identify priorities for improvement, provide support on any further steps to take and highlight any additional training which might be useful to access. We will review governor-related documentation from meetings, monitoring visits and the school's website. Over the course of a day, conversations will take place with each of the following: the governance professional (clerk), the headteacher, the chair of governors and two members of the governing board. Following the review, a detailed report will be written outlining the Board's strengths and recommending areas for improvement.

### **Analyse School Performance (ASP)**

This will help staff and governors to increase both their familiarity with Analyse School Performance and their ability to analyse statutory school data, using the Inspection Data Summary Report (IDSR) and the School Performance Summary Report.

## The Bible Course

The Bible can often seem like a confusing book, with many stories, thoughts and events which at times can appear to be unrelated. Understanding the big story of the Bible can support how we understand a variety of aspects within school leadership, including setting vision, theology of leadership, understanding our mission in the community and leading effective Collective Worship.

The Bible Course is delivered over eight sessions; originally written for use in churches, this course explores what the Bible is, what story it tells, and how it relates to your work in a church school. This course is intended to support you in your understanding of the Bible and how to apply the knowledge and understanding you gain from the eight sessions to your work in school.

Every session will link to two of the twenty-four leadership practices as highlighted in the Church of England's 'Called, Connected, Committed' document, as well as reflections which relate the learning to the SIAMS Framework and/or the Understanding Christianity RE resources.

After an incredibly successful first year of The Bible Course, we have expanded the offer and the sessions will now be offered in both the autumn term and the summer term. Here are a few the testimonials from those who attended last year:

- "The pitch has been absolutely perfect for me and I have thoroughly enjoyed learning about the Bible in such great detail. I didn't realise how much I would be wanting to share with people on a Friday night or during lunch here!! Whether it be deep things about how 'wisdom is about learning to live life well' or lighter facts such as Jesus having six siblings (which blew my staff's minds!) or the derivation of the term 'scapegoat'! ## The Bible in a Year: A Collective Worship Resource

Tuesday 23rd September 2025 10.00am - 12.30pm



Collective Worship can be a wonderful time of stillness, reflection and calm in a busy day. A key part of worship is learning from the Bible and hearing the stories that it contains. These stories are central to the Christian faith and are how Christians begin to understand who God is and what he is like. However, often the stories that we tell can seem a little disjointed and out of place. This in turn may give children a false reflection of how the events of the Bible fit together.

This resource has been created to support Collective Worship by taking pupils on a chronological tour of key stories of the Bible. Using the themes from the Big Frieze in Understanding Christianity, this resource enables Collective Worship to be relevant, meaningful and shows how everything fits together.

Each Collective Worship session contains; a Bible reading, a summary of the key learning from the story, a link to school values, a reflection, suggestions for linking the story to the world and suggestions for introducing Christianity as a globally diverse faith.

This resource is only available to schools who attend training.

#### In this course we will:

- explore key concepts of the Bible
- explore the resource and how it fits into a yearly plan for collective worship
- look at how to plan Collective Worship using the resource.

### Delivering Understanding Christianity

Tuesday 7th October 2025 10.00am - 3.30pm

Understanding Christianity (UC) sets the bar for high quality teaching and learning of Christianity in our schools and academies. It reinforces the messages given nationally relating to 'digging deeper' and 'lingering longer' when engaging children and young people with the big ideas and concepts of religion and belief. During this course, support will be given in relation to where these materials fit with both the Worcestershire and Dudley Agreed Syllabi, in addition to lesson planning and whole school implementation of the resources.

This course is aimed at RE Subject Leaders and teachers who are already using the UC materials within school and who would like to further develop the key messages of Understanding Christianity including a chance to discuss best practice with other leaders using the resource.



#### RE Subject Leadership

### Collective Worship: The Heart of the School

This course is aimed at headteachers, clergy and Collective Worship leads within a school. Collective Worship should be the beating heart of the school. SIAMS inspectors request that schools send them a brief summary (two sides of A4) of their ongoing self-evaluation for the purposes of inspection. This session looks at possible formats for this summary document and suggests how schools can make the most of their summary to give inspectors pertinent knowledge of their school's strengths as a church school.

It is particularly effective for schools to send two or more representatives to this course. This module runs in conjunction with SIAMS Self-Evaluation - Supporting you in writing your SEF, although attendance at both is not mandatory. Please bring a charged laptop with your ongoing SIAMS Self-Evaluation and School Development Plan.

### Spirituality & Wellbeing

#### Developing an Approach to Spirituality

Tuesday 3rd February 2026 10.00am - 12.30pm

Developing spirituality is a key part to helping children, young people, and adults to flourish in all that they do in school. The current SIAMS Framework requires spirituality to be developed separately from moral, social, and cultural education. Understanding spirituality continues to be a common SIAMS area of development nationally.

This course will consider what spirituality is and help delegates to begin to create a shared common language for spirituality within their school that maintains the integrity of Christianity whilst being inclusive to all faiths and none.

Following this course delegates may find Spirituality in the Curriculum and Beyond on Wednesday 4th March 2026 also of interest. However, each course can be attended as a stand-alone session.

#### 2023-24 SIAMS annual report by Margaret James about Spirituality:

"Inspection evidence indicates that inspirational, inclusive, and invitational collective worship continues to be at the heart of many Church schools. However, one caveat to this is that many schools' limited collective understanding of spirituality is a detrimental factor in both pupils' and adults' spiritual flourishing through worship. If schools do not have an understanding of what spirituality is, they cannot create the conditions for spiritual flourishing and they cannot make any informed comment on whether anyone is flourishing spiritually or not."

### Spirituality in the Curriculum and Beyond

Wednesday 4th March 2026 10.00am - 12.30pm

Developing spirituality is a key part to helping children, young people, and adults to flourish in all that they do in school. The current SIAMS Framework requires spiritual development to be an intrinsic part of the curriculum, enabling pupils and adults the opportunity to flourish both academically and spiritually. Through the framework we also see the importance of finding ways to support pupils' spiritual development throughout the school, not just through Collective Worship.

In this course we will look at:

- · where can spirituality be found in the curriculum
- ideas for developing spirituality in the curriculum and beyond.

## Christian Teaching and Learning about Identity, Sexuality, Relationships and Marriage

Tuesday 17th March 2026 10.00am - 12.30pm

This session enables delegates to explore the guidance and tools given to church schools in two Church of England publications, Flourishing for all: Anti-Bullying Guidance for Church of England schools (2024) and Mental Health and Wellbeing: A Whole School Approach (2018).

Using this guidance to church schools on preventing and addressing homophobic, biphobic and transphobic bullying, delegates will consider how schools may support young people who are exploring or questioning their gender identity and sexuality. Delegates will also reflect on the inclusivity of their school's policies and practice through the lens of the Equality Act 2010 and the SIAMS Framework.

In the Mental Health and Wellbeing section, delegates will consider strategies that can be used to audit wellbeing across the school community.



#### Walking directions from Lowesmoor

#### Route I

Enter the Lowesmoor Wharf site and head to the left-hand side of the units directly opposite the entrance (including Worcester Foodbank). Follow the road with the units on your right and the housing on your left. Take the right-hand curve in the road as you reach the entrance to Worcester Marina and follow the road to the end.

The Diocesan Board of Finance (DBF) offices should be directly in front of you. The front door can be accessed down a couple of steps. Please ring the intercom on arrival; a member of the team will come to greet you.

#### Route 2

Enter the Lowesmoor Wharf site and head to the right-hand side of the units directly opposite the entrance (including Worcester Foodbank). Follow the road with the unit wall on your left and the 'Canal-side offices' on your right.

As you reach a building directly in front of you (NPC Power), head to its left and walk through the pedestrian gap in the low wall. The DBF offices should be directly in front of you.
